Ipha Lambda continues to move ONWARD and UPWARD! In the fall of 2021, the chapter was immensely proud to initiate 16 new brothers, the Sixteen Pharaohs of Triumph. These new brothers bring forth a great deal of energy and spirit to this historic chapter. The Alpha Lambda Education Foundation (ALEF) started the new year off with the annual Martin Luther King, Jr. HOPE Breakfast. On this occasion we awarded seven young high school students with scholarships to attend the college or university of their choice. Although restrictions due to the COVID-19 pandemic have been significantly reduced, precautions are still under observation until further notice from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Recently, the brothers of the Alpha Lambda chapter sponsored a Health Wins session at the Antioch Missionary Baptist Church in coordination with the University of Louisville Medical Department. Brothers assisted with traffic control and administered the second vaccination and booster for people throughout the community of Louisville. Additionally, the Alpha Lambda chapter, along with the Alpha Pi chapter (collegiate brothers), hosted a second virtual Kentucky District Conference in Louisville. Due to the pandemic, the collegiate Miss Black and Old Gold Pageant to choose a contestant for the Midwestern Regional Conference was a hybrid event. Meanwhile, the brothers worked on other fraternity initiatives such as 1) the March of Dimes/March for Babies Campaign, 2) Project Alpha, which supports middle school aged students in coordination with the West End School of Louisville, and 3) the brotherhood sponsored a phone-a-thon event with Big Brothers and Big Sisters (BBBS) of Kentuckiana.

However, don't stop there! The brothers are currently organizing another Health Wins session for African Americans who do not get regular checkups. This seminar is free to the community. Additional events include Bowling For Kids' Sake, Alpha Lambda celebrating 111 years of existence since its chartering on April 11, 1911, and much more. Finally, the chapter will be sending six delegates to the 90th Midwestern Regional Conference in Kansas City, Missouri.

come.



## 2022 BBBS of Kentuckiana: FOR KIDS' SAKE







# BROTHER TITUS H. EXUM

rother Titus H. Exum was born on October 19, 1945, in Jackson, TN. Raised in Gary, IN, he graduated (c/o 1963) from Roosevelt High School. Bro. Exum continued his studies at Lincoln University in Jefferson City, Missouri. It was there that Bro. Exum joined our dear fraternity. He is a Spring '66 initiate of the Alpha Psi chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

After graduating with a degree in education, he taught in Kansas City and served in the U.S. Army. After 22 years of service in the Army, Bro. Exum retired. At the time of his retirement, he was a Lieutenant Colonel (LTC). He previously spent time in Fort Knox but did not envision life in Kentucky. His original plan (after retiring) was to go back to Seattle, WA or Anchorage, AK. However, life has a way of redirecting us.

Bro. Exum officially moved to Louisville in the mid-1980s after receiving a job as a teacher. He taught at Westport Middle School and Iroquois High School. After years of teaching, he was promoted to administrator and served at Western Middle School for several years before retiring from Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS).

Bro. Exum continues to be impactful by supporting veterans and the initiatives of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc whenever he can. He states, "I am glad to be a member of Alpha Phi Alpha and proud to be an HBCU graduate."


